Why do people do genealogy?

- 1. Curiosity...
- 2. To pass on an understanding of ancestors.
- 3. To preserve family, local, cultural, ethnic traditions and stories for the next generations.
- 4. Family medical history.
- 5. To join a surname, lineage or heritage society.
- 6. To solve family mysteries.

Basic Genealogy

At the very least you will want to find and record, for as many people as possible in your family tree, this data:

- 1. date and place of birth
- 2. names of parents
- 3. date and place of marriage
- 4. date and place of death
- 5. names and birthdates of children

Start with what you know

Begin by writing down everything you know about your family:

- Names
- Dates of birth, marriage, death
- Places of residence
- Stories of emigration and travel
- Occupations
- Family myths and mysteries
- Anything else that occurs to you

Even if all you have are rough dates and more questions than answers, it's a place to begin.

Use FGS & Pedigree Trees

This is a good time to use a blank Family Group Sheet and a Pedigree Tree...use a pencil!

These are handy 'thinking tools' and they are useful when you approach other members of the family for more information.

Be sure to note if you are unsure of any fact – this will help guide your discussions with family members and to choose which 'fact' to begin searching for.

Interviewing Family Members

- Talk to your relatives do this sooner rather than later! If no one in an older generation is left, try any older siblings or cousins.
- Use FGSs, pedigree trees, family photos, etc. to kick start your conversation(s).
- Have questions ready but don't feel like you need to stick to them if the conversation is flowing.
- Ask 'open-ended' questions 'What do you remember about our grandfather?', etc.
- Take notes or better yet, record the interviews if that's comfortable.
- Go back for more...people often remember the good stuff after you are gone! Visit them again.

Searching for Records

Generally, you'll want to try and find as a beginning point, BMD & census records for your ancestors and anyone else on your tree that is of interest.

It's best to start as close to the present as possible and work your way back in time.

This way you can usually verify facts (and that you are finding the 'right' people) with your memories and records or by checking with other family members.

Finding Information

- Most family history data sources are created as a result of people dealing with government or the church.
- Consider who created the record and why.
- Think about life events (BMD), buying land, going to school, etc.
- Use CyndisList and FamilySearch Wiki to learn more and to find a source.

Search the Internet

- I typically type a person's name and profession into Google just to see if anything pops up.
- However, DO NOT take any of this information as 100% accurate, even if it comes from published sources.
- **Be especially wary** of online family trees as many of them are un-sourced and often cobbled together and contain inaccurate material.

Federal Government Records

Records to be found at this level:

- Military
- Federal census
- Federal land transfer to individuals
- Naturalization (post-1868) but with lots of exceptions
- Immigration—customs & immigration passenger lists
- Federal court cases
- Social Security death index
- Passport applications

State Government Records

Records to be found at this level:

- Military (State militias largely Civil War and pre-Civil War)
- State censuses
- Naturalization
- State court cases (including divorce)
- BMD records (but check county & city as well)
- Probate (do check county & city as well)

County Government

America's 50 states are divided into more than 3,000 counties.

Their duties can include:


- Vital statistics (BMD)
- Probate courts (wills are dealt with largely at County level)
- Welfare
- Administration of education
- Police and court services

A quiet revolution is taking place.

State governments have been sifting through their historical archives, digitizing records, and putting mountains of content on their websites. The result is a goldmine of information, newly available online. This is great news for historians, professional genealogists, family history researchers, students, journalists, or anyone wanting to know more about the communities in which they live and work.

State archives are digitizing documents, photographs, videos, oral histories, music, deeds, artifacts, court records, slave emancipation records, newspapers, reports, military records, and so much more. These really are amazing resources.

It's a *quiet revolution* because hardly anyone knows about it. States have neither the skills nor the resources to fully market the information they are putting online. Many of the archives are not terribly user-friendly, so even users who stumble across the sites may not realize the treasures that await, if they just dig a bit.



Censuses

The best way to place a person in a certain place at a certain time...

Federal Census – taken from 1790-present.


- Used to apportion number of Representatives and Federal taxes to the States.
- Mandated by the US Constitution.
- Taken every 10 years.
- Accessible from 1790-1940. (72 year privacy limit)

Federal Census Issues

- Enumerators simply wrote down information given to them by head of household. No proof of data required.
- In most years, all persons temporarily absent on a journey or visit were to be counted with the rest of the family in their usual abode.
- ❖ 1790-1840 name of head of household only with numbers of others in household.
- 1890 census records were largely destroyed by fire.

State & Special Censuses


State censuses were often taken in years between the federal censuses. Collected data such as:

- agriculture and taxation assessment
- tallies of school-age children and potential school populations

There were also special Federal censuses:

- 1890 special census of Civil War Union veterans and widows of veterans
- Slave censuses of 1850 & 1860
- Mortality schedules listing persons who died in a given year.

Where to find Census Records

- FamilySearch www.familysearch.org Federal censuses (1850-1940), State censuses (many States & dates).
- U.S. GenWeb Census Project www.us-census.org/search.html Transcribed Federal censuses (1850-1920).
- ❖ Fold3.com 1860 &1930 Federal censuses are complete, 1900-1920 are being worked on.

Where to find records

- Ancestry (worldwide version)
 Federal censuses from 1790-1940 plus a 'substitute' collection for 1890. Slave censuses, mortality schedules, and a few State censuses.
- Cyndislist has a great list of censuses available at different websites.

Birth, Marriage, Death

The term in the US is 'Vital Statistics/Records'.

- States track this information but events are registered and certificates are usually granted at the **County** level.
- States began keeping these records at differing times; many from the late 1800s but not all until 1919.
- Look for the office of 'State Bureau or Division of Vital Records'.

BMD Records

- There was no national standard for what these records contain until 1900.
- Birth and marriage records are often much less informative than UK records. Try to get a long birth certificate if available.
- ❖ Death certificates are second-hand sources of birth information so must be treated with caution. But they are often quite informative!

Birth Certificates

'Short' birth certificates have very little information – name, sex, parents' names, date and place of birth.

Many states will only issue short birth certificates.

'Long' birth certificates have more information on the parents – occupations, length of marriage, residence address and more.

Marriage Records

Marriage records often contain the license, certificate and the license of record on one sheet.

Federal censuses from 1900 & 1910 asked 'years in present marriage' and 1870 & 1880 asked, if married within the census year, what month the marriage took place.

Death Records

- Death certificates often have much information on the cause of death, time of residence and parentage.
- The Social Security Death Index (SSDI) is a list of deceased persons holding a SS number whose death was reported to the SS Administration. Very useful but limited.
- Monumental inscriptions the FindAGrave and BillionGraves webpages are great sources.



How to find BMD Records

It helps to know the state and probably the county where your ancestor lived to track down their BMD records.

Check census records first to find out where someone was born, they are also a good indirect source of birth and marriage dates.

Order copies of certificates directly from the State or County – don't go though a 'middleman'

Please follow the provided <u>Application Guidelines</u> to ensure an accurate response to your request.

The federal government does not distribute certificates, files, or indexes with identifying information for vital records. Applications for passports can be obtained through the U.S. State Department [7].

County Clerks & Courthouses


You may just need to contact the County Clerk for a copy of your desired B, M or D certificate. Especially true for records pre-1920 and marriage certificates.

You will have to pay a fee for the service, which will vary by county. You can usually do this by post but you can go in person as well...a great holiday idea!

Genetic Genealogy - DNA Testing

- Genetic testing can help determine relationships and ancestral origins.
- Tests genetic material from living people to determine close matches.
- A variety of tests are available.
- Best used in conjunction with document based research.
- Be aware that you might discover unexpected relatives! Consider testing quite carefully...it can have consequences for your entire family.





Tahitia McCabe's autosomal bio-geographical test results from the company FTDNA




My old Ancestry biogeographical results








