- 1 in 3 women has been sexually assaulted in her lifetime;
- Rape continues to be used as a weapon during war and conflict;
- Globalization and climate change are having the most profound impacts on women and children who are disproportionately being displaced and left without options;

Gender-based violence is an affliction that millions of women and children suffer in silence and shame. Many become victimized by those that are supposed to love and protect them.

While it is important that we don't focus only on human trafficking or commercial sexual exploitation and lose sight of other forms of violence and oppression, it is an area that is receiving increasing attention globally because of its prevalence and the pace at which it is increasing worldwide.

More people are enslaved now than at any other time in history, and it is estimated that up to 80% or more of them are women or girls.
