These environmental tips were created during the Region 4 roundtable sessions when we discussed how we as individuals, FAWCO Clubs and Communities could have a small, medium, and large impact on creating a greener world.

SMALL

Small means personal changes you can make at home, at work and with friends.

Ŭ	Eat all the edible parts of vegetables – leaves, stems, etc.
Å	Do not purchase single-use plastic bottles
Ŭ	Buy local products
Â	Stop using plastic garbage bags and start reusing your own shopping bags
Ô	Practice zero waste management: assess what you throw away and eliminate as much as you can
	Use shampoo bars
Â	Reuse plastic containers in a safe manner
Ŝ	Ride your bike more
	Think about energy efficiency at home in electricity and heating
	Use solar panels
	Hang your laundry – don't use the dryer

Suggestion #1 Know Your Members When you start promoting a Green Team at your club, remember that you need to know your members Create a Survey or poll to understand local interest Create doable small challenges that are fun, realistic and can be a group activity		
Create a Survey or poll to understand local interest		
Consider projects that produce a visible impact to promote your club		
Do you have a green activist in your club? Engage!		
Suggestion #2 Know Your Clubhouse		
Consider how your own club handles catering – can you create less food waste?		
How does your club recycle paper, drink containers, etc?		
Can your club make use of recycled paper products?		
Can you reduce energy consumption at your clubhouse?		
Expand your audience with more virtual meetings and workshops		
Suggestion #3 Know Your Community		
Think local – can you partner with companies active in ongoing green initiatives in your city and community?		
Consider how your club can act as a green role model for the community		
Understanding waste management rules in your community is important. For example, what is		
recyclable? If not all your members speak the local language, create a waste management tip sheet to		
help them reduce waste.		
Is there a grassroots environment charity that your club can support through a FAWCO Foundation Development Grant?		
What apps area available in your community to help members reuse and recycle? Examples given:		
Freecycle (reuse from landfills), Marktplatz (multipurpose reseller) Vinted (fashion), Sparetoolz (rent		
power tools)		
Organize clean up days with international schools		
Partner with the city to start a community garden project		
Know the local farmers and producers in your area		
Suggestion #4 FAWCO Green Teams Collaboration		
Have a representative on the Global Environment team for pick up and share best practices, discuss environmental issues, and initiate actions		
Network with other FAWCO member clubs to understand successful green campaigns, activities, and		
share best practices		
Identify possible speakers for your club based on other clubs' selections – or create a multi-club in virtual		
speaker series about environmental issues		
Review the Environment Newsletter for good ideas on carbon offset projects		
Don't wait for the next regional to network and share ideas		
Suggestion #5 Green Team Activity Ideas		
Lunch and Learn sessions on environmental issues		
Upcycle: Fashion clothing swaps, clothes donations, event at a small vintage shop		
Raise awareness with Environmental Calculators, example footprintcalculator.org		
Organize Clean Up Days: beach, canal, streets		
Zero Waste workshops: Make an ugly vegetable stew		
Set a club challenge: Go veggie for one week and write about your experience		
Creativity Workshop: Make something new out of something old		
Hold a reforestation fundraiser		
Book Recycle projects or Book sales with proceeds going to fund members attending FAWCO meetings		
Start a Bloom Club – members gardening together		
Hold a Green Campaign: 12 days of Green		
Re-wild – bring back native plants to the area to attract birds and bees		
Start a beehive		
Plan a club excursion to local farmers and shops		
Suggestion #6 COMMUNICATE		
Add green elements to your club newcomer orientation package		
Create a Local Foods orientation workshop for members		
Add Green Tips to club communications: Tip of the week or tips of the month
