Dunfermline and Andrew Carnegie



We leave Edinburgh this morning and make our way to the Forth Bridges. Opened in 1890, the Forth Bridge is a Scottish icon that is recognised the world over as the most famous of cantilever designs. It is now a UNESCO World Heritage site and is flanked by the Forth Road Bridge and the brand new Queensferry Crossing.



Our journey then takes us to Dunfermline to visit the Andrew Carnegie Birthplace Museum. Discover how Carnegie became the richest man in the world and father of modern philanthropy.

Spend the rest of the morning exploring what Dunfermline has to offer, including Dunfermline Abbey where some of Scotland's greatest medieval monarchs were laid to rest.



This afternoon, travel to the Royal Burgh of Culross. This charming village is the most complete example of a 17th and 18th-century burgh in Scotland today.



Our last visit of the day will be to view the magnificent Kelpies - the world's largest equine sculptures dedicated to the horse-powered heritage of Central Scotland, designed by Andy Scott. They also celebrate the mythological transforming beasts living in our lochs, rivers and streams, who possess the strength and endurance of 100 horses. We return to Edinburgh early evening at around 4pm.
