## I) I have a name and an identity!

Achieved by:

- Civil registry services and Courts directly in refugee camps (e.g. Jordan)
- Using mobile systems to register children remotely (e.g. Burkina Faso, Kenya, Colombia, Tanzania)
- Inclusion of birth registration within the vaccinations campaign (e.g. Sudan)
- Installing Civil registration for refugees (e. g. Ethiopia)
- Registration regardless of parents' nationality and legal status (e.g. Thailand)
- Data management framework and database on children to better manage migration (e.g. Ghana's Integrated Management Approach, (GIMMA))\*

**With birth registration, you can improve data collection for Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) so I am not left behind (SDG 16.9).**

## Registering my birth:

- Makes me visible (GCM\*: Obj. 4(d, e); GCR para 58, 82)
- Lessens my risk of exploitation (GCM: Obj. 11(f))
- Prevents my becoming stateless (GCM: Obj. 4(e); GCR: para 60, 82, 83)
- Provides me with the information I need (GCM: Obj. 3(c), 8(c))
- Enables you to create specific pathways for my age group as well as protect and address my particular needs (GCM: Obj. 5(g), 7(c, g); GCR: para 54, 59, 74-77)
- Enables you to facilitate my family reunification (GCM: Obj. 5(i), 8(c); GCR, para 76, 95)
- Enables me to go to school or job training (GCM: Obj. 15, (d), (g); GCR: para 68-71, 95) and to access basic services (GCM: Obj. 15(d); GCR para 54, 65-66, 74, 76)
- Helps establish when it is legal for me to work (GCM: Obj. 6(g), 7(c); GCR para 77)
- Enables my consulate to assist me and my family (GCM: Obj. 3(c), 7(f), 13(e),

## 2) I can develop my skills, talents and learning and reach my full potential!

Achieved through:

- ECD for children zero-six (e.g. Rwanda)
- Education for refugee and displaced children (e.g. Chad, Chile, Save the Children and Good Beginnings, Australia)
- Access to free basic education for children born abroad and without identification documents (e.g. Thailand)
- Access to education for migrant children (e.g. Mexico)
- Action Plan for migrant and refugee children (e.g. EU)
- Assessment of higher education qualifications (e.g. European qualification passport for refugees)
- Strengthening of the education system for all students (e.g. RACE II program & Caritas, Lebanon)
- The Global High School for Refugees (e.g. SKY School)
- Connection of refugees to international job opportunities (e.g. "Talent beyond boundaries")\*\*

**With access to education for all children, you can ensure inclusive and quality personal development for children in my situation (SDG 4).**



## Education allows for:

- Investment in my early childhood development (GCM\*: Obj.15 (g); GCR para 69)
- Promotion of my social integration (GCM: Obj.16(a, i), 21(a, h); GCR para 84, 92, 97-99)
- Celebration of my cultural identity (GCM: Obj.16 (a, g, i), 21(g); GCR para 44, 81, 84, 100)
- Support of my aspirations and potential (GCM Obj. 16(g, i), 18(a); GCR para 68, 70-71, 75) and the opportunity to lift myself out of poverty (GCR, para 55, 66)
- Protection from trafficking and smuggling (GCM: Obj. 9, 10; GCR para 57-58), sexual violence (GCM: Obj. 7(d); GCR para 57, 75), child marriage, sale or recruitment in armed conflict (GCR: para 75)
- Recognition of my qualifications and well-matched job opportunities (GCM: Obj. 5(e), 16(d), 18(a, b, c, h, 21(h); GCR: para 71, 77, 95)
- Facilitation of my empowerment to become an agent of change and peace if I am a girl (GCM: Obj. 5(d), 16(e), 17(e); GCR: para 74-75, 77, 95)

### **3) I have the ability to survive, develop and grow up healthy!**

Achieved through:

- Access to maternal and child health services; (e.g. Argentina)
- Access to psychosocial support (e.g. Lebanon, Jordan, Canada); targeted training-providers (e.g. Jordan, IOM)
- Preventive medicine and vaccinations (e.g. Greece, UNICEF)
- Child friendly spaces (e.g. IFRC, UNICEF)
- Access to water and sanitation, health, nutrition and primary education in camps (e.g. World Vision, Uganda; Tanzania; Caritas Internationalis, East & Horn of Africa)
- Healthy borders (e.g. Greater Mekong sub-region) and coordinated health services (e.g. Sri Lanka)
- Improved access to health care services for minority groups and irregular migrants (e.g. EQUI-Health, IOM, EU Commission)

**With access to health services at all ages of childhood, you can ensure healthier lives and greater well-being for children like me (SDG 3).**

### **By giving me access to health services at all ages of childhood, you can:**

- Reduce morbidity and mortality (GCM\*: Obj. 7(d, g), 15(a, f); GCR, para 72-73)
- Facilitate my access to water and sufficient, safe and nutritious food (GCM: Obj. 7(f), 13(f); GCR, para 78-81)
- Prevent me from contracting communicable and non-communicable diseases (GCM: Obj. 15(a, f); GCR, para 73)
- Reduce my risk of developing mental/psychological conditions and future violent behavior (GCM: Obj. 10(h), 13(f), 15(f); GCR, para 59, 72-73)
- Protect me and better address my special needs if I am a child with disabilities (GCM, Obj. 7(b, c, g), 15(d); GCR para 54, 59, 72, 76)

#### 4) I have the ability to exercise my human rights regardless of my or my parents' migration status!

Achieved through:

- Social-economic equality in the cities (e.g. Champion Mayors for Inclusive Growth Initiative)
- Access to health and education (e.g. Sweden)
- Visa to access to education and health (e.g. Chile)
- Platform to report xenophobic violence (e.g. South Africa)
- Legal counseling for children in transit (e.g. “Blue Dots”, UNICEF, UNHCR)
- Implementation of the “firewalls principle” (e.g. PICUM)
- Confidence building in policing and criminal justice (e.g. Northern Ireland)
- Prohibition of sharing non-clinical information for immigration purposes (e.g. UK)
- Implementation of a structured national reception system for unaccompanied and separated children (e.g. Italy)

**With public services independent from immigration enforcement, you can promote my involvement in the community as part of the realization of just, peaceful, and inclusive societies (SDG 16).**



#### This independence contributes to my ability to:

- Access basic services (GCM\*: Obj. 7(g), 15(c); GCR: para 68-69, 72-73)
- Report a crime, xenophobic treatment or sexual violence without being arrested or deported (GCM: Obj. 6(k), 15(e), 16(i), 17(e))
- Obtain legal assistance (GCM: Obj. 3(d), 7(g), 13(d), 21(g); GCR para 60), allowing me to remain in non-custodial care (GCM: Obj. 13(a, h); GCR: para 60)
- Become an active member of society (GCM: Obj. 16; GCR para 84, 86, 97-98)
